### Karoo Conversation by Sonia Elliott

#### How I got the shot

#### Pam wrote -

This was a composite of two images. Both shot indoors with a black background. The natural light was reasonable in the room. I used an 18 to 250mm lens.. Shot about 100 ICM pics at 1.3 seconds. Chose the one I liked best, did a few adjustments in Lightroom. Then I shot a couple of pics of the same arum lily, chose one and after minor adjustments in Lightroom selected the sharp image and superimposed it on the ICM version in Photoshop. I used F8 and an ISO of 100, shooting the sharp image at 1/125.

Sonia said -

The background shot was taken on the road from Prince Albert to the Fig Farm on my Fuji XT3 with an 18 -24 lens. Near noon on a very hot day so the pic was light and flat, but I loved the scenery.

Brought back contrast and corrected lighting in raw converter.

In PS I applied dodge and burn to enhance features, especially the foreground of the road, and distant top of mountains.

The petrol pump I found in Namibia, and the figure is a local often found at the morning market here. Both taken as close as possible so I had enough pixels to do a heavy crop needed for a composite.

I adjusted the colour toning of the composite (not colour shades) of darks, lights and midtones in Lightroom to get the picture's elements to work together.

Shadows and Lighting on the two figures were added in separate layers in PS.

The colour result didn't seem to capture the Karroo story, so I converted to a high tone sepia in Nik Silver Efex, and did final tonal tweaking in Lightroom.

The photo was taken using my Panasonic Mirrorless DMC-GX85 ,Olympus Macro Lens 60mm, f5.6, 1/60sec, ISO 200 Manual Focus. Post processed using mainly "masking tool" to enhance the subject and to soften the background.

## **Editor's Choice**



FREE FALLING: COMPOSITED IMAGE, PUBLISHED

This month Luana Laubscher has been kind enough to tell us about her photographic journey.

We all know Luana as a highly talented artist and her imagination is reflected in her work.

Thanks for sharing, Luana.

I was born in Cape Town, of Italian parents. My full name is Luana Annunziata Damiani (In Italy, women usually retain their maiden surnames – it's just the status that changes, i.e., Signora (Mrs). My school career comprised 8 different schools as my father travelled around and the whole family accompanied him.

For as long as I can remember, I've had a camera in my hands – I still remember clearly, the excitement of the wait outside CNA while they processed my film at the 1-hour stall. I would wait (im)patiently, and then go through the photos and remove

the flops, and only paid for the ones that were passable. Bearing in mind that my pocket money was limited, I had to be ruthless with what I wanted to keep and which to ditch. Already then, a Judge!

I still have some of my old film cameras, and even ventured back down that road, and purchased a Holga (plastic) camera about 8 years ago. It came with a roll of insulation tape so that one could choose to close up the holes or allow the light leaks in and create the typical Holga look. The only place which developed film at that stage was Orms. The negative came back, together with the scanned and digital version (on a disk),

and thus enable one to edit accordingly.

The 1<sup>st</sup> club I joined was KPS.

Pam helped me send in my 1<sup>st</sup> two images (I think it was in 2008/2009). They were taken with a Konica 2-megapixel camera and both were landscapes of Sedgefield. Much to my delight and surprise, I received a gold. With Sonia's help, I purchased a 2<sup>nd</sup> hand Canon 450D, and thus began my path to where I am today. Sonia introduced me to a program called Picasa and immediately thereafter, Elements (a prior version of PS). The transition to Elements was seamless and it opened up a whole new world for me. Over the years, I realized that representational photography was never going to keep my attention, and slowly began exploring the

more artistic side of photography. Encouraged by

both Pam and Sonia, I explored ICMs, double

exposures

and texture additions. Furthermore, I explored using different lenses to the traditional, for eg: Fisheye Lens, Extreme wide angle, Lensbaby etc

After about 3 years, I was given the PRO portfolio at KPS, and I introduced the very first competition evening. It was called Golden Hour, and so began a tradition which continues to this day. Thereafter, I was elected as Chairperson, and held this position for 3 years. Together with my fabulous and hard-working committee, those 3 years enriched my photographic scope.

also held the Judge Co-ordinator Portfolio for a year after my Chairmanship. By this time, Judges were already in the "hot seat" once they reached 3-star status.



It was rather daunting to have such a huge responsibility at the tender level of 3-star status, however, being a judge has contributed significantly to my becoming a better photographer and getting to grips with the various genres. It has, in fact, been the members' submissions which have taught me so much.

I received my LPSSA in 2010 (I think!) We were allowed to submit both colour and mono in 1 panel. I received it on my 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt. But what I *really* loved making was Audio

Visuals. Music transcends language, and I began to make

AV's. These are +-3min films, using music and still images, and creating a story (or photo harmony). Nor to be confused with a slide show to pleasant music. The AV division was run by Adri Van Oudheusden, a consummate AV maker from PE, and so began my love for this genre of Photography. At a Congress in Tsitsikamma, I saw Willem Oets' work for the 1<sup>st</sup> time (both photography and Audio Visuals) and that was the start of fascinating side of photography. I have received both my LPSSA and APSSA in Audio Visual – both on the 1<sup>st</sup> attempt. I have won many awards, internationally, in this field. I'm currently part of George Audio Visual Makers who are very active and productive.

Nowadays, I'm much more relaxed about my photography and have found that although I still submit to Clubs (I'm also a member of the George and Wilderness Camera Clubs), I'm having so much more fun. . I tend to the more "Neverland" type of image, where I'm free to explore a make-believe world where, photographically speaking, nothing needs to make any sense.






